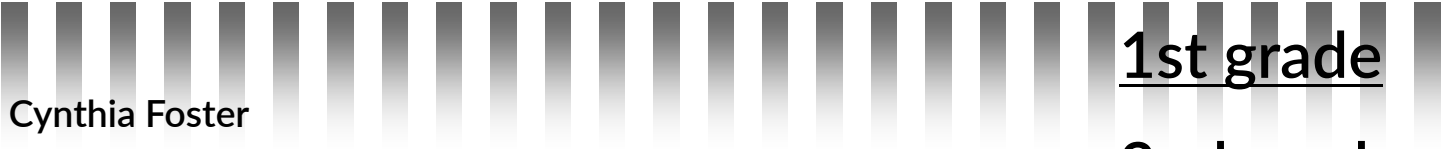

Library: Remember your library books on or before Thursday, September 17, 2026.

Reading:

First Grade will be starting Module Two - Week One. The students will be reading a story called Dan Had a Plan. The **Spelling Test** will be on **Thursday**, September 17, 2026 with the following words: in, pig, did, sit, dig, big, are, little, said, will, you, too - (Bonus Words - help, mess, market). **Phonics** - The students will be working on words with "Short i"

Second Grade will be starting Module Two - Week One. The students will be reading a story called Many Kinds of Matter. The **Spelling Test** will be on **Thursday**, September 17, 2026 with the following words: doze, nose, use, rose, pole, close, June, woke, rule, rode, role, tune, cold, small, life - (Bonus Words - space, amount, material). **Phonics** - The students will be working on words with "Long o and u."

Math: Second Grade will be working on addition facts - sums of ten, reading a thermometer to ten degrees, round numbers to the nearest ten, and congruent line and Assessment 3.

Social Studies: The students will be starting Chapter One - Lesson Two.

Science: The class will be doing some mini-lessons on "Why do you become a great inventor?"

Handwriting: The students will be working on forming their letters correctly.

Memory Verse: "The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want." Psalm 23:1

Memory Verse Challenge: Pastor Warneke and Ms. Foster is challenging all first and second graders to memorize this year's school memory verse, which is the following: "As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, rooted and built up in Him and established in the faith, as you have been taught, abounding in it with thanksgiving. Colossians 2: 6-7. " When **ALL (14)** students have memorized this verse, there will be a reward for all students.

Homework: Please have your child practice their spelling words and memory work nightly. Your child should read for 20 minutes daily. Please fill out the reading log and return on Friday for a chance at the Treasure Box. Your child's weekly math / literacy sheet is due on or before Friday.

Snacks: The students are welcome to bring their own healthy snacks daily.

Dear 3rd and 4th Grade Families,

We will be walking to Baden Square this Tuesday at 1:30 to enjoy some Walnut Valley Festival Music. Please be sure your child wears appropriate walking shoes on this day.

Mid Quarter reports were sent home on Monday. Please contact the office if you did not receive one in your child's Monday Mail Folder.

Please be sure your child brings a water bottle to school daily.

Snacks: 3rd and 4th grade students are allowed to bring a morning and afternoon snack if they would like.

Here is a look at our week:

3rd Reading: This week we begin Module 2. Our theme for this module is "How Do People Express Themselves Using Words?" We will be reading a realistic fiction story this week called Dear Primo." We will also be focusing on text and graphic features, the central idea and retelling. Our phonics lessons this week will focus on long "O" and long sounds. Our spelling, reading comprehension and vocabulary test will be on Friday.

4th Reading: This week we begin Module 2. Our theme for this module is "How Do People and Animals Use Their Senses to Navigate the World?" Students will be reading an informational text called "The Science Behind Sight". We will also be focusing on the central idea, text structure and summarizing. Our phonics lessons this week will focus on the short "O" and long "O" sounds. Our spelling, reading comprehension and vocabulary test will be on Friday.

3rd Math- Students will work on addition story problems, missing numbers and adding hundreds numbers.

4th Grade Math- Students will work on story problems, Lines/numberlines/tally marks, and multiplication.

Science- This week in science, students explore how animals receive information through their senses and process that information in their brain, using instincts and memories to guide their behaviors. In the activity, Raccoon Reactions, students use models to understand how an animal's senses, brain, and memories all work together as a system to influence their behavior and support their survival.

Memory work- "But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin." 1 John 1:7

Memory Work: 5th - "Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. So they are no longer two but one flesh. What therefore God has joined together, let not man separate." Mark 10:7-9

Extra Credit: Small Catechism:

- What is the Fifth Commandment? You shall not murder.
 - What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body, but help and support him in every physical need.
- What is the Sixth Commandment? You shall not commit adultery.
 - What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we lead a sexually pure and decent life in what we say and do, and husband and wife love and honor each other.

Reading: Students will continue practicing finding good text evidence to back up their answers about our novel, *Holes*. Students will identify and write about symbolism in *Holes*.

Word Work: This week's root is, "ply" or "plic." If morphology work is not finished in class, it is homework. Please ask your student if all of their green folder work is finished!

Math: Please ask your student what they have been learning in math. You may find it beneficial to have them bring home their math book and homework every day, so that you can watch them grow in their understanding.

Science: This week we will continue studying Unit 2 Ancient Weather & Climate. We will read together and work on vocabulary for Chapter 6 Pre- Flood Climate, and Chapter 7 Climate Changes Due to the Genesis Flood. Students are to study their Chapter 5 Vocabulary words for a vocabulary test on Wednesday.

Geography: Students will continue to learn key terms necessary for our study of Geography. We will learn about how weathering and erosion impacts our Earth. We will learn the names of various landforms.

ELA: We will finish and publish our "Best Part of Me" writing. We will continue working on our 8 parts of speech with a special emphasis on adjectives.

Art: We will study "The Great Wave off Kanagawa," by Katsushika Hokusai. We will note how line shows motion and recreate the piece, making it our own.

ELA: This week we'll dig into what has influenced our reading and writing thus far and what we want to accomplish in both areas in the future. We will finish our first expository paragraph.

Art: This week, we'll try our hand at the Japanese art of notan.
